Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart: Today at each mass will be recited the *Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus*. A plenary indulgence is available today (under the usual conditions) for its public recitation.

New Phone Procedure for Sacramental Emergencies: Henceforth, it is unnecessary to use a special phone number for urgent sacramental needs; rather, simply call the number for the church, (402) 477-5145, and follow the instructions given. Please make sure to have handy this number for St. Francis Church **and** the number for your registered parish.

All Saints' Day: This Saturday, November 1, is the Feast of All Saints, a holyday. Since it falls on a Saturday, the precept to attend Mass does not oblige, according to the Church's particular law for the United States. However, assistance at mass on this day is highly encouraged. The simple exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for First Saturday will follow.

All Saints' Day Party: After mass this Saturday, November 1, there will be an All Saints' Day Party, meant especially for the children, for whom there will be activities and treats. All are welcome and encouraged to dress as their favorite saints! Please bring something to share for a potluck brunch, and a bag or two of candy (depending upon how many children you bring) to share among the children.

The Commemoration for All Souls this year will be on Monday, November 3. Three Masses will be offered.

Plenary Indulgences Available for the Poor Souls: From November 1—8 inclusively, a plenary indulgence, applicable only the Poor Souls, is available each day for one who visits a cemetery and prays, even if only mentally, for the departed.

The 40 Days for Life Prayer Vigil concludes this week. We of St. Francis will finish our vigil on Wednesday, between 10 am-2 pm, in front of the Planned Parenthood facility, at the Northwest corner of 48th St. and Old Cheney.
