Divine Mercy Sunday: Please remember that next Sunday, April 27, is Divine Mercy Sunday. There is a plenary indulgence (under the usual conditions) for those who participate in Divine Mercy devotions in any church, or even who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, recite an Our Father and Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord, e.g., “Merciful Jesus, I trust in Thee!” (There are lesser requirements for those unable to go to a church.) The “usual conditions” mentioned are: Holy Communion on the day of the indulgenced work, Confession within a short time before or after, detachment from any sin, and prayer for the Holy Father's intentions.

Confessions on Divine Mercy Sunday: In addition to their normal times, confessions will be heard following the 10:00 am mass next Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday.

First Friday Eucharistic Adoration will next be held Friday, May 2, 2014. The sign-up sheet is posted in the vestibule; please be generous in devoting your time in adoration of Our Lord, and in reparation to His Sacred Heart!
