

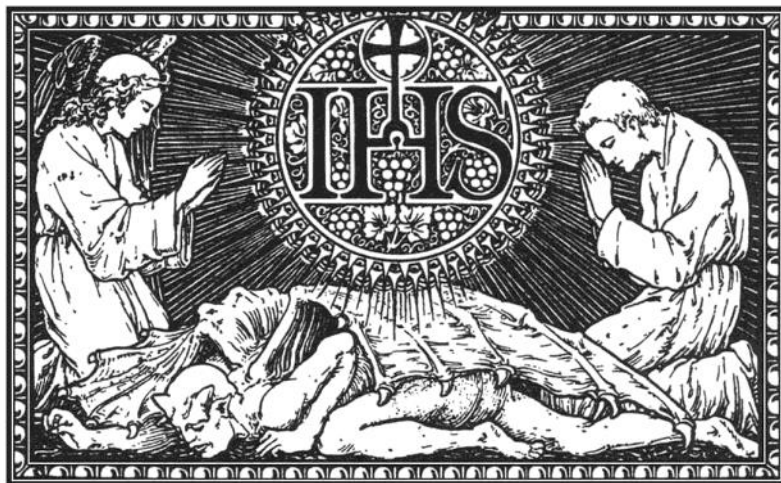
THE RECTOR'S DESK
