Schedule for All Saints' Day and First Friday: This Friday, November 1, is All Saints' Day, a Holyday of obligation, and also the First Friday. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin after the morning mass, as usual, concluding with the Dolorosary at 4:45 pm and Benediction at 5:45 pm, followed by the evening mass at 6:00 pm.

First Saturday: As this Saturday is All Souls' Day, with three masses in succession, there will be no period of simple exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. (One can, of course, individually keep the First Saturday devotion.)

Plenary Indulgences Available for the Poor Souls: From November 1-8 inclusively, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is available each day for one who visits a cemetery and prays, even if only mentally, for the dead.
