

THE RECTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends of St. Francis Church,

I pray that you and your families are well! During the Year of Faith (October 11, 2012-November 24, 2013), there are in the Diocese of Lincoln a number of Indulgenced Places of Pilgrimage. At these places, a devout Catholic pilgrim may gain a plenary indulgence, either for himself or for one of the holy souls in Purgatory. These places are:

The Cathedral of the Risen Christ (3500 Sheridan Boulevard, Lincoln);
Eucharistic Shrine and Adoration Chapel of Christ the King (1040 South Cotner, Lincoln);
Cor Mariae Schoenstatt Center (340 Highway 103, Crete);
Carmel of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph (9300 West Agnew Road, Agnew-Valparaiso);
Marian Fatima Shrine (912 Chestnut Street, Arapahoe);
Saint Luke Czech Catholic Shrine (Main Street, Loma).

To obtain the plenary indulgence, the pilgrim must be in the state of grace and have the intention of gaining the indulgence either for himself or for a soul in Purgatory. The pilgrim then must take part in some sacred function at the place or else pause for a few moments of pious meditation, concluding with the recitation of the Our Father and the Apostles' Creed, and a request for the intercession of the Blessed Virgin or the patron saint of the place. One must also say a prayer for the intentions of the Pope, receive Holy Communion, and, within eight days before or after the pilgrimage, go to confession.

A wonderful opportunity to gain such an indulgence will be during the Novena to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, held at the Carmel in Valparaiso from July 8-16. There will be morning and evening masses with the Novena Prayers, as well as a sermon each evening. One can derive both the benefit of making the Novena, and of gaining the pilgrimage indulgence. More details are posted in the vestibule. I pray that many of us will make this Novena, and at least a part of it at Carmel. May the good God bless you and your families!
