

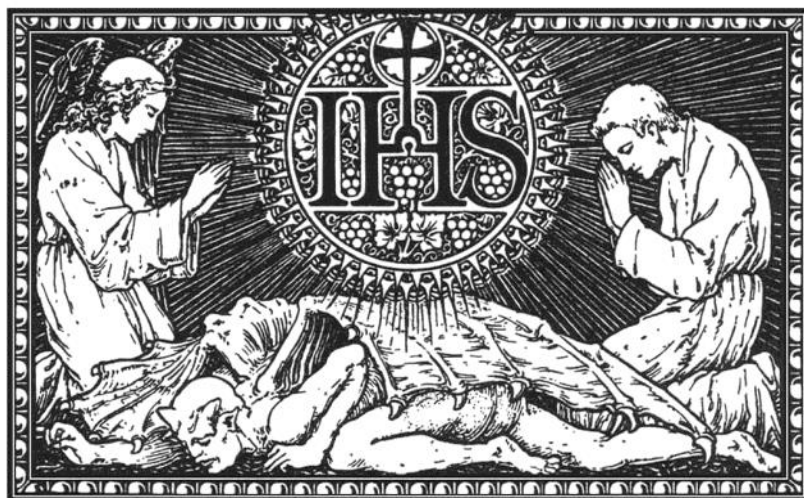
THE RECTOR'S DESK

From His Excellency, Bishop Conley: The Diocese of Lincoln requires that its employees and volunteers report any allegations of physical abuse or neglect of a minor or elder, connected with church related activity, to law enforcement, consistent with the requirements of Nebraska law. If anyone has information that a minor or elder is being or has been subjected to physical abuse or neglect, please report it immediately to local law enforcement or to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (toll-free number 1-800-652-1999), and also to any Parish Pastor, School Administrator, Teacher, or to any Diocesan official at the Catholic Chancery, (402) 488-0921, so that immediate steps may be taken for the protection of the minor or elder.
