The instantaneous cure of a woman suffering with an issue of blood (Gospel) by a mere touch of Christ's garment is an image of the restoration of the body in its complete, natural perfection at the resurrection, of the triumph over all ills that precede and lead to bodily death. Christ will endow our bodies with such brightness and beauty that the just shall shine as the sun in the kingdom of their Father: 'He will reform the body of our lowliness, made like to the body of his glory' (Epistle.)”

Inspired by meditation upon these truths, let us strive to keep our bodies worthy temples of the Holy Ghost, looking forward to the glory of the resurrection. May the good God bless you and your families!
